INTERACTING WITH HORSES

Bowen is semi-rural, so when you encounter horses on roads or trails, for everyone's safety, please be aware of the following rules and safety practices.

- Crippen Regional Park has 5.6 km of shared trails. Cyclists yield to hikers. Hikers and cyclists yield to horses. When encountering a horse, calmly move to the side of the trail, remain within the horse's view, and refrain from sudden movements that can startle the horse.
- Shared Roads: Under the BC Motor Vehicle Act pedestrians, cyclists, herded animals and ridden horses are all considered traffic when using public roadways. This means that all modes of traffic have the same rights and duties as the driver of any type of motor vehicle.

To share the road safely and responsibly with horses, car drivers should slow down, stay at least two meters away from the horse, and only pass at a slow speed when it is safe to do so. Do not accelerate when passing. This could spook the horse and cause an accident that you may be held liable for. 
THE WATERING CAN SUPPLY

Dedicated to fostering sustainability and reducing waste, **The Watering Can Supply** offers a wide range of refillable household and personal care products, as well as environmentally-friendly and health-conscious gifts, jewellery and more. Owner **Casey Kennedy** says "I put my heart into product research. We are continuously fine tuning our products to ensure what you bring into your home not only cuts down on waste but is also safe for your family and our environment. Everything in the shop is used in my own home with my family and animals, including my 7-month-old daughter."

The Watering Can Supply opened in **November 201**9, four months before COVID shut the world down. Casey didn't think the store would survive. But she credits the community for rallying behind her and for embracing sustainability.

Over 90% of the products stocked are local BC makers, creators and artists, including many Bowen Islanders. "We offer a discount to any local business that uses us for refills and we are proud to be in many larger businesses on Bowen, as well as cleaning services and AirBnBs. We've even hosted field trips from BICS and had an entire class come in and practice their refill skills and ask about sustainability." – Casey Kennedy


CREATES LOCAL JOBS AND SUPPORTS LOCAL GROWERS & PRODUCERS

EAT. DRINK & CELEBRATE

MEADOWBROOK FARM

Meadowbrook Farm is evolving and transforming into a food and drink hub. If you haven't already discovered this mid-island stop, we recommend that you do. Currently, the Meadowbrook Market kitchen serves hot food for take away or picnic, such as sandwiches, chilli and sides. Chef/butcher **Dylan** offers a selection of handcrafted meats and sausages and during the fall and winter months you'll find Frank Patt's The Soup Fairy. Both have a loyal customer following, so that speaks volumes. Dylan uses local ingredients as much as possible, including lamb raised on Bowen and produce from local farmers. Watch for a freshfood market opening spring 2022.

Meadowbrook Farm is operated by the Johnstone family and is home to Bowen's newest cidery, the Bowen Cider House, slated to open this spring. The vision for the cidery started 13 years ago when the first trees were planted on the 7.5 acre farm. Currently, there are 700 apple trees and approximately 40 different varieties, but the orchard will expand significantly in the coming years. Bowen Cider House will initially open with a tasting room and retail sales, with plans to offer a picnic area and eventually a full-service indoor lounge. And if that's not enough, they're working on becoming a fully-licensed event venue for weddings, parties and special occasions. So there's lots happening at Meadowbrook Corner. SIP LOCAL BEVERAGES

If you haven't noticed, there's a libations renaissance taking place on island. While **Doc**Morgan's and The Bowen Island Pub are still local favourites, Copper Spirit Distillery
started a transformation with its boutique craft organic spirits and cocktail lounge. Riley's
Cidery opened in summer 2021 and the Bowen Cider House, at Meadowbrook Farm, will
open spring 2022. The Bowen Island Golf Course's **Shed Eatery** is licensed and has a great
patio overlooking Howe Sound and **Barcelona Tapas & Wine Bar** features wine on tap
and Spanish beverages. So grab a friend and enjoy a cold one at one of Bowen's local
drinkeries.

HEIRLOOM APPLES & HANDCRAFTED CIDERY

RILEY'S CIDERY

Over a 30-year period, **John** and **Josephine Riley** planted almost a thousand varieties of heirloom apples creating a one-of-a-kind orchard right here on Bowen Island. In 2019, Christine and Rob took over the orchard with the vision of both preserving the unique orchard and transforming its fruits into a new product to be shared and enjoyed. After more than two years of preparations, **Riley's Cidery** opened its doors in July 2021 and they've been blown away by the positive response from locals, many of whom bring friends and family to enjoy the outdoor patio, a space where you can bring-your-own-picnic and sip cider. In October, Riley's Cidery received international endorsement, their **Sip & Tell** cider winning gold at the International **Brewing Cider Awards**.

Christine and Rob live with their two children on the property and they each bring their expertise to the business. Christine studied at the University of BC, completing a practicum in sustainable agriculture, and while living in England she trained at the **Cider and Perry Academy** in Herefordshire. Rob's background is finance, but he's equally at home tending to the orchard and working in the cidery. For more information and hours of operation visit rileyscider.com

Andrea grows high-quality and unique varieties of flowers suited to Bowen's climate and, in line with her values, the flowers are all field grown, cultivated without any pesticides and watered with harvested rainwater. LITTLE SONG FARM MICROGREENS

Charmaine and Park Heffelfinger moved to Bowen Island in 2010 and live with their two daughters. By day Charmaine is an interior designer and Park was co-owner of the **Memphis Blues BBQ restaurants**. Wanting to grow food for their family, they started **Little Song Farm** in 2015 and now have 2 acres in production, a flock of chickens and a green house.

Seeing a niche, they started production of microgreens in November 2020. The sprouts are grown indoors under controlled conditions for optimal harvesting and this enables them to produce fresh healthy greens throughout the year. They sell directly to most of the local restaurants and the greens are available for purchase at **The Ruddy Potato** and via subscription. Little Song Farm has also partnered with **John Jerman**, owner/operator of **Think Organic Big Ideas**, a weekly harvest box subscription service. And if that's not enough, Charmain and John also sell tomato, cucumber and basil seedlings for people who want to grow their own. **Contact Charmaine at littlesongfarm@gmail.com**

Three years later, BISCo's products and sassy-marketing messages have attracted loyal customers from around the globe.

Everything is handmade on Bowen using high-quality, plant-based ingredients and is cruelty- free "because we care about what people use on their bodies and because these ingredients are better for the environment and planet," says Helen. BOWEN'S HEALTHCARE SERVICES EXPAND

DR NICHOLAS LENDVOY | BOWEN ISLAND INTEGRATED HEALTH

Chiropractor and musculoskeletal specialist **Dr. Nicholas Lendvoy** and his wife Jessica moved to Bowen Island in 2016. Seeing the healthcare gap in the community, he teamed up with physiotherapist **Greg Smit**h to open **Bowen Island Integrated Health** in 2019. The objectives were to improve accessibility to patient-centred services and to create a centre where healthcare practitioners can work on island, instead of commuting.

Their vision has been warmly welcomed and the team has grown from 2 to 16 professionals, each contributing complimentary medical practices, from mental health and dental services to diversified physical therapy and community nursing. In fact, Integrated Health has grown so much, they're expanding and moving into a new, larger space that increases treatment rooms, creates an exercise area for sport therapy sessions, and enables new services including acupuncture, traditional Chinese medicine and podiatry.

When asked what he likes to do on his days off, Dr. Lendvoy confessed that his two-year-old son tends to set the schedule. This typically includes feeding the ducks at the lagoon, stopping at **The Snug Café** or **Tell Your Friends**, and perhaps a little catch-and-release fishing at Grafton Lake. Then they might head to the **golf course** for a little practice on the putting greens, grabbing a smokie at **Meadowbrook Market** on the way. There's often a dog walk at the Cape or a paddle if it's warm and, if time allows, a **Cocoa West** hot chocolate on the way home. Wow!
